OXFORD LOCAL EXAMINATIONS (G.C.E.)

In the Advanced Level examinations, five boys obtained three Grade A passes each (Grades obtained on the Special Paper are shown in parentheses):—

M. S. BROWN in Physics (2), Chemistry and Mathematics; J. I. DAVIES in Mathematics (1), Further Mathematics (2) and Physics; R. K. DE LA MARE in History (1), English and British Constitution; M. A. FOSTER in History (1), English and British Constitution; and T. R. ROBERTS in Mathematics (1), Physics (1) and Further Mathematics.

Four boys also obtained two Grade A passes each:—

S. R. HASLER in Chemistry (1) and Mathematics (with a B2 in Physics); W. H. HUBBARD in Chemistry (1) and Mathematics (with a B2 in Physics); R. A. LAMPERT in Chemistry (1) and Mathematics (with a B2 in Physics); and J. R. RYDE in Mathematics and Chemistry (with a B in Physics).

Sixty-four candidates between them took 199 subject examinations; 77.4% of these were passes, and nearly half of all these passes were at "good" Grades, Grade A or Grade B.
